Personal care:



- dressing
- bathing
- toileting
- eating

Help with daily tasks:



- cleaning
- grocery shopping
- meal prep and/or delivery
- running errands



Home health care and therapy:

- Physical Therapy
- Occupational Therapy
- Speech Therapy
