About the Study

We are conducting a research study to understand the role that the community environment plays in the daily lives of people with spinal cord injury (SCI).

Participants will complete an online survey; wear a study-provided Smartwatch & download a phone app to map trips using GPS; respond to Smartphone surveys 3 times/day about real-time activities & experiences; complete computer-based interviews to discuss trip maps & experiences in the community.
